REVINGEHED ÖVNINGSFÄLT MILITARY TRAINING AREA

The training area is used by the Swedish Armed Forces for military exercises. Please read and follow the advice and restrictions below.

DANGER

Exercises with heavy vehicles and the use of training and simulated ammunitions are common even if the training area is not closed off.

Keep your distance and make yourself visible to military personnel.

DO NOT TOUCH AMMUNITION OR MILITARY EQUIPMENT.

DO NOT ENTER A RESTRICTED AREA.

PROHIBITION FOR THE PUBLIC*

- According to the Off-Road Driving Act, driving motor vehicles in the terrain, i.e. off the roads, is forbidden.
- No motorized vehicles on private roads within the training field.
- Public roads within the training area can be closed off during military exercises.
- A no parking zone applies to the entire area. Parking may only take place in designated places.
- Restricted areas at certain times according to notices at the training areas information boards and www.mil.se

*Please read more about the above prohibitions in Skyddslagen (2010:305) and Förordningen om skydd och samhällsviktig anläggning, 151 § vägtrafikkungörelsen (1972:603), 1 § terrängkörningslagen (1975:1313) and 1 § lagen om kontrollavgift vid olovlig parkering (1984:318).

RESTRICTION ON THE RIGHT OF PUBLIC ACCESS

- Horseback riding on cross-country trails or on military training facilities is prohibited.
- For camping and setting up caravans, reference is made to campsites outside the military training area.
- Dogs must be on a leash at all times. All forms of training of dogs require a permit from the Swedish Fortifications Agency.
- Fishing within the training area is prohibited without the landowner's permission.
- Parking is only allowed in designated parking spaces, see the map. Parking spaces inside barriers cease to apply during exercises.
- Temporary restrictions are displayed at the training areas information boards and at www.mil.se
